The Board met with Chairman Sullivan, Selectman Pena, Selectman Bresnahan, Selectman Witherow and Selectman Fay.

The Board met with Edward McCann the acting Town Administrator. Mr. McCann presented to the Board the proposed ballot questions to appear on the Election Warrant for April 23, 2001.

The Board voted to place on the April 23, 2001 Election Ballot the question of whether to exempt payments of debt service on the \$4,153,900.00 Fire Station Bonds from the annual tax limitation, pursuant to G.L. c59, S21C(k). The Board approved the following ballot question to appear on the April 23, 2001 Election Warrant: Shall the Town of Ayer be allowed to exempt from the provisions of Proposition two and one half, so called, the amounts required to pay for the bond issued in order to construct a new fire station, including acquisition of real property for the site thereof by gift, purchase, eminent domain or otherwise, appraisal, architectural, engineering and remediation services and other professional services including the preparation of plans and specifications and all original equipment and furnishings normally associated with the construction of a municipal fire station? made by Selectman Pena, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Selectman Bresnahan, VOTE: unanimous, so moved.

The Board also reviewed the Community Preservation Act Sections 3 to 7 of Chapter 44B of the General Laws of Massachusetts and Modification of the Town Landfill to appear on the Election Warrant also.
