1. Public Hearing Continuation-Nashoba Club Transfer of Stock-All Alcohol License

The Board met with Atty. Richard Larkin and Robert Rakip Jr. Selectman Sullivan read the legal notice which ran in the Nashoba Publication Newspaper the week of 2-8-00. Chairman Bresnahan requested if there were abutters present, no one stepped forward. Chairman Bresnahan called for a motion. Selectman Sullivan moved the Board vote to re-affirm their vote of 2-1-00 and approve the transfer of Stock to Robert Rakip Jr., 2nd by Selectman Pena, VOTE: unanimous, so moved.

- 3. Crabtree Booster Station: The Board approved of Supt. Girouard's recommendation to charge proportional cost for any new construction tying into the Water Booster Station of \$1,172.55 for each additional unbuilt/new construction lot at Crabtree Development. Motion made by Selectman Sullivan 2nd by Selectman Pena, VOTE: unanimous, so moved.
