

Project Overview





Project Overview

- Install 1,320 feet of new 8-inch water main to replace existing 1898 6-inch pipe
- Install 2 new fire hydrants
- Install new water service pipes from water main to property line (curb box)
- Cleaning and relining of 1,355 feet of 1948 sewer pipe and sewer manholes
- Removal of existing drainage structures and installation of new structures including deep sump catch basins and drainage trunk line



Project Overview (continued)

- New concrete sidewalk with granite curbing in location of existing sidewalks
- ADA Compliance for sidewalks and crosswalks
- New pavement



Why are we doing this?

- Replace aging pipes, roadway, and sidewalk
- Improve walkability / mobility in the neighborhood
- Improve the community
- Project is predominantly funded from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

Schedule

- Work will start in July
- Beginning with water main followed by sewer rehab and drainage installation
 - First step is installing temporary water
- Second step, new gas main and services to be installed by National Grid
- Last step, new sidewalks and pavement
- Contractor will work from 7:00 to 3:30, Monday through Friday
- Estimated completion in late fall




Construction Procedure

- Majority of sewer work will not require digging
- Contractor will dig utility trenches, install pipes, backfill as they progress and pave trenches (Friday)
- After water main is tested, new services to the buildings will be installed
- Sidewalk, curbing, and paving to occur after utility upgrades are complete



Impact on Water & Sewer Use

- Service interruptions will be minimized
- Residents and businesses will be notified of any scheduled shut offs
- Water Department staff may need to enter house to shut of cellar valve
- If you don't have water at your tap notify the Resident Engineer, DPW or Police dispatch



Traffic Control and Public Safety

- Police details will be on site at all times that work is being done in the street
- Signs will be placed for construction area and detours
- Detours will be setup based on the work location along Pleasant Street (from Main to Cambridge, Cambridge to Groton, Groton toward Howard)
- Local residents will have access as directed by Police detail
- Police and Fire have priority during construction



Street Parking

- Street parking will be limited during construction
- Signage will be posted to areas where parking is not allowed
- Residents may want to relocate their vehicle to outside of the daily construction area to minimize delays



Access during Paving/Sidewalk Installation

- Sidewalk construction
 - Signage to indicate closed portions
 - No passing on concrete driveway aprons for 2 days
 - We will provide information to specific properties prior to driveway restrictions
- Roadway paving
 - Binder course (one day)
 - Final paving (one day)
