Chairman Norstrom called for a motion to accept the Agenda. Selectman Hamel moved the Board approve the Agenda for 10-6-97 as amended, 2nd by Selectman Bresnahan.

Chief Rizzo stated he had received SEVEN (7) bids: on 4 & 5 day cleaning options: The Board after a brief discussion and per the recommendation of Chief Rizzo awarded the Janitorial services for the new police station to Ace Cleaning Services for a 5 day/wk service for the low bid of \$9,100.00 a year with a thirty (30) day exclusive; Motion made by Selectman Hamel, 2nd by Selectman Bresnahan, VOTE: unanimous, so moved.

Chief Rizzo met with the Board re: the Sergeants Promotional Process. Chief Rizzo stated there is a need for a Sergeants Exam to be conducted due to Edward Denmark's promotion to Lieutenant. Chief Rizzo stated he should have three (3) sergeants on board presently- he only has one (1) Sgt. LaPrade has been out due to operation. The Chief presented to the Board examples of the written test and current books to assist the applicants. Applicants must have three years tenure with town. Selectman Hamel requested if there is such a position as Detective-Sergeant. Chief Rizzo responded in larger municipalities there are such positions but certainly not for the size of the Town of Ayer. The Board authorized Mr. Kreidler to submit a letter to BRAC officials concerning the clean-up of Moore Air Field, motion moved by Selectmen Bresnahan, 2nd by Selectmen Hamel, VOTE: unanimous, so moved.

The Board appointed Donna Torres and James Drapeau to the Ayer Conservation Commission per the recommendation of Robert Eldredge, Chairman of the Ayer Conservation Commission, Motion made by Selectman Bresnahan, Chairman Norstrom stepped down as Chair to 2nd the motion, Vote 2-1 with Selectman Hamel abstaining.

The Board moved to support Sylvia's Haven Grant application contingent it does not interfere with the Town of Ayer's Rehabilitation Program Funding-and Deven's does not compete with Ayer for funding under the Mass. Cities Program.

Selectman Bresnahan requested the Board put a list together of their individual priorities for the Town and to also request Town Departments also submit a list of their priorities.

The Board congratulated the Ayer Fire Dept on their successful entry into the Fire Fighters Challenge. Ayer placed high considering it was the Town's first event.



Earlier today, Mr. William Murray of David E. Ross Associates, Inc., called this office in regard to the above listed matter. Mr. Murray described a conversation he had with you and the General Contractor for the Police Station construction regarding the site specification's requirement to have the drainage system "jetted" from the point of connection to its outlet.

As you may be aware, the jetting was performed last week by this Department, at the request of the Massachusetts Highway Department. Given the condition of the pipes involved and the fact that this was activity that was recently performed, it is in this office's opinion that additional jetting of this drainage system is unnecessary and should not be conducted.
