• Approval of Meeting Minutes

- BAS moved to accept the minutes for 3/2/2016 as amended; BES 2^{nd} .
 - Motion approved unanimously.
- Correspondence/Bills
 - <u>Lowell Publishing Company (Nashoba Publishing)</u>: \$168.26, legal notice in Nashoba Valley Voice, 2/19 and 2/26, @\$84.13 each, for Sandy Pond School Association Public Hearing held 3/2/2016.
 - JG moved to approve payment of \$168.26; BAS 2nd.
 - Motion approved unanimously.

• CPC Warrants for Spring Town Meeting, 5/9/2016

- The spreadsheet for CPC budget balances, as of 4/6/2016, was reviewed.
 - The spreadsheet does not yet include distribution of the FY2017 set-asides.
 - Some designations of spending were questioned and JP will review these with Town Accountant Lisa Gabree.
 - JP will also see whether some unexpended balances can now be closed out.
 - These include the Pleasant Street pocket park, the Town Hall generator, and the Fletcher Building.
- Three Warrant Articles for STM 2016 were reviewed for vote.
 - The FY2017 annual set-asides from the local CPA surcharge and State matching funds total \$231,633.
 - The first CPC Article distributes these set-asides as follows:
 - \$5000 for administrative costs;
 - \$180,307 to the CPA category of Open Space;
 - \$23,164 to the CPA category of Community Housing (10% required minimum);
 - \$23,164 to the CPA category of Historic Preservation (10% required minimum).



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- RD moved to accept the Warrant Article as written and reviewed; BES 2^{nd} .
 - Motion approved unanimously.
- The second CPC Article transfers \$12,000 from the Community Preservation Fund for general Open Space purposes, including due diligence.
 - JG moved to accept the Warrant Article as written/reviewed; RD 2nd.
 Motion approved unanimously.
- The third CPC Article requests permission to spend up to \$20,000, from CPC's line item for Historic Resources, for the Sandy Pond School Association's Conditions Assessment funding project.
 - JG moved to accept the Warrant Article as written/reviewed; RD 2nd.
 Motion approved unanimously.

CPC Application Packet review

- JG circulated a draft of updates and revisions made thus far to the Committee's application packet.
- Feedback was given and JG will continue preparing a new draft.
