Implemented Initiatives

• EPG Solar Array (Southbridge, MA)

- 20 Year Net Metering Credit Contract
- Estimated Savings of \$1,000,000 over 20 years

Town Hall Automated Controls

- 75% reduction in electricity consumption
- \$5,000 energy rebate
- WWTP Main Pumping Station Conversion (Oil to Gas)

3 Successes and Best Practices

- Awarded Green Community Status
 - Challenge: stretch code adoption at ATM
 - Best practices:
 - Building code expert on committee
 - Presentations to BOS, Finance, Conservation, citizen groups, etc.
- 20 year SOLAR net metering contract
 - Challenge: wading through process and regs
 - Best practice: get help from expert
- Overall Municipal Energy Reduction
 - Best practice: work with town staff, let others "own" project

Two Lessons Learned

• Solar

- 3 false starts
 - About to hire a consultant with criminal background
 - Attempted to engage in a deal that sounded too good to be true until Commonwealth stepped in to stop it
 - Worked with reputable company whose business plan changed and they pulled out
- Lessons: be persistent, get professional help

Projects requiring town meeting approval

- Have good solid information and plan and be prepared to answer questions
- spend lots of time "selling" the idea

Two Plans for Next Year

Anaerobic Digester

- WWTP sludge converted to methane gas which is combusted to produce electricity
- \$40,000 Grant to develop concept
- Electricity produced will be used by Ayer DPW and WWTP
- LED Street lights
 - Purchase street lights from National Grid
 - Conversion to LED

Two Metro West Collaborations

• Street light conversions to LED

- Joint purchase will save money
- Work together to understand and complete required steps

• Joint application to Solarize program

- Program to promote individual solar projects
- A multiple-town application is more likely to lead to a successful grant
