# Ayer Community-Wide HISTORIC RESOURCES SURVEY Phase II

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#### **ABSTRACT**

The purpose of this project was to undertake the second phase of a historic resource survey of significant historical and architectural resources located in the town of Ayer with the goal of building a comprehensive survey that encompasses all buildings over 50 years of age. This project identified historic resources that meet the criteria for the inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places and to make recommendations for nomination of such properties. This survey also provides recommendations for future survey efforts.

The work built upon survey work undertaken in several stages since 1985. Between 1985 and 1993, four separate inventory efforts by separate entities identified 34 individual buildings, three areas, two objects, and eight bridges. A 2003 Community-Wide Preliminary Historic Resource Survey Plan laid the groundwork for the 2007-2008 Historic Sites Survey, which produced inventory forms for 114 buildings, two burial grounds, and one landscape. Three individual buildings and two historic districts in Ayer are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Included in this survey are 146 primary buildings. Form B – Building inventory forms were prepared for 43 primary buildings and 3 outbuildings. Form A – Area inventory forms were prepared for 4 areas, which included 84 primary buildings, 7 outbuildings, 7 monuments, and 2 structures.

A National Register of Historic Places context was identified in the area of Residential Architecture in Groton Junction during the Early Industrial Period (1830-1870). As a result of the survey, one individual property is recommended as eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. It is also recommended that one existing historic district listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1989 be expanded to include a building that was not yet 50 years of age at the time of listing.

This historic sites survey was funded in part by the residents of Ayer through Community Preservation Act funds.

Original survey forms and a copy of this report are housed at the Ayer Library.

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#### 1. Methodology

#### SURVEY OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this project was to undertake the second phase of a historic resource survey of significant historical and architectural resources located in the town of Ayer with the goal of building a comprehensive survey that encompasses all buildings over 50 years of age. This project identified historic resources that meet the criteria for the inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places and to make recommendations for nomination of such properties. This survey also provides recommendations for future survey efforts.

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The project objective was to research and document on standard MHC forms properties identified in the 2003 Plan that were not surveyed in 2007-2008, as well as properties chosen by the Ayer Historical Commission (AHC) for local significance or are at risk of demolition. In the RFQ for this survey, the AHC provided a Preliminary List of approximately 90 properties to be investigated.

The project survey was undertaken in compliance with Massachusetts Historical Commission (MHC) criteria and methodology. Current standards are MHC's *Historic Properties Survey Manual: Guidelines for the Identification of Historic and Archaeological Resources in Massachusetts* (1992), *Survey Technical Bulletin #1* (1993), *MHC Interim Survey Guidelines* (March 1999, et seq.), and *MHC Interim Guidelines for Inventory Form Photographs* (2009), MHC *Technical Guidelines for Electronic Files in MHC S&P Surveys* (2020), as well as the Secretary of the Interior's Standards and Guidelines for Identification (1983).

The MHC Reconnaissance Survey Town Report for Ayer and existing survey forms on file with the MHC provided a preliminary framework and base of information for this analysis. Individual forms and area forms expanded upon information in the Town Report and related inventoried properties to the significant themes in the historical development of the town. The survey related cultural resources to historic patterns of cultural development, land use, economic development, social and demographic history, and events that had an impact on the community.

#### CRITERIA FOR SELECTING PROPERTIES FOR SURVEY

While the majority of the properties on the Preliminary List are residential, the list included a diversity of building types and uses: a Civil War monument; downtown commercial buildings; a railroad bridge; a dam; a carriage house; a lunch counter converted to a Buddhist center; mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century commercial buildings including a supermarket, shopping center, and a former diner; and, a Fotomat. The proportion of single-family residential buildings to other building types is reflective of the composition of Ayer's historic and present-day built environment. The majority of the properties on the Preliminary List are located along the main thoroughfares in Ayer, *i.e.*, East Main Street, Main Street, West Main Street, Sandy Pond Road, Fitchburg Road, Groton School Road, and Groton-Harvard Road.

Phase I of this project included a reconnaissance survey of Preliminary List properties as well as properties in adjacent areas in order to obtain a sense of property types and styles, architectural integrity, and geographical distribution. Buildings on the Preliminary List that did not retain sufficient architectural integrity were removed from the survey list.

#### Initial observations:

- Ayer has a well-preserved downtown historic district of multi-story brick or frame buildings along Main Street adjacent to the railroad. The cohesive streetscape reflects rebuilding efforts after an 1872 fire claimed the area. Construction there continued through the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.
- Ayer has a significant number of single-family residential buildings constructed circa 1850-1915 in three large areas: North of Main Street, South of East Main Street and West Main Street. Construction came as a result of the four railroads that intersected here beginning in the 1840s.
- Mid-20<sup>th</sup> century buildings were well-represented on the Preliminary List. Ayer's proximity to Fort Devens and the presence of Route 2A resulted in construction of one-story retail shopping centers, restaurants, and supermarkets during the 1940s-1960s.
- A small number of former farm dwellings outside of the downtown area, constructed during the late 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, were included on the Preliminary List.
- Vacation cottages near Sandy Pond, constructed in the 1910s-1930s, were included in the Preliminary List.

- Some buildings were included on the Preliminary List as a result of the 2003
   Historic Resource Plan recommendations. In the intervening years, some of
   these buildings had been substantially altered or demolished and were removed
   from the Preliminary List during Phase 2.
- Few outbuildings such as barns and shops are present alongside many of the properties. Where present, these associated buildings were documented in relation to the primary dwellings.

#### The following criteria for selecting properties for survey were proposed:

- Inclusion on the Preliminary List;
- At risk through tear-down, subdivision, or advanced deterioration and more than 50 years of age;
- Architectural quality and integrity: Higher rather than lower, given the extent of other inventoried properties; Strength and clarity of visual character are important factors;
- Historical Merit: Resources associated with themes or events that represent patterns in local history;
- Shared history and grouping: Specifically for potential small areas;
- Contribution to the streetscape: Visibility, prominence, relation to nearby properties that may better demonstrate historical or architectural themes as a group than as individual properties;
- Visibility from the public way and physical presence in Ayer.

#### PROCEDURES AND PRODUCTS

The Survey followed the basic procedures as all inventory work: field survey; research; evaluation; and, production of inventory forms.

In Phase I, preliminary work encompassed a reconnaissance survey of the types and geographical distribution of cultural resources in areas presented in, and adjacent to, the Preliminary List, site observation of all of the Preliminary List properties visible from the public way, and an overview of documentary research with which to establish a context for analyzing Preliminary List properties. Criteria for selecting and removing properties from the Preliminary List were developed and finalized in collaboration with the AHC and MHC. Potential additional properties were suggested as a result of field reconnaissance. A base map to be prepared by the town's department of public works was selected; the map features lot lines and building footprints.

In Phase II, architectural assessments and documentary research were continued, agreed-upon selection criteria were applied to the Preliminary List, and a final list of specific properties to be surveyed in this project was developed in collaboration with the AHC and the MHC. Draft inventory forms for different property types were produced for review and comment by the AHC and the MHC.

In Phase III, inventory forms were prepared for all agreed-upon properties, potential National Register contexts were identified, and National Register criteria were applied to all inventoried resources. The survey record consisted of standard MHC Forms A and B and include each property selected for inclusion in the inventory.

Research sources included town directories, historic atlases, town histories, and MACRIS (the MHC database of historic resources). The collections of the Local History Room of the Ayer Library were consulted. When merited and where possible, state and federal censuses and vital records such as birth and death records were consulted via web-based resources such as Ancestry.com. Secondary source information was also accessed through web-based research and archive sites such as Archive.org and HathiTrust Digital Library. Deed research was undertaken strategically.

In Phase 4, inventory forms were finalized and numbered according to MHC requirements, National Register Criteria Statements were finalized, and a final base map and street index of all inventoried properties was prepared.

#### 3. National Register of Historic Places Eligibility Recommendations

# A. Historic Context: Residential Architecture in Groton Junction during the Early Industrial Period (1830-1870)

Prior to the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, Groton Junction (present-day downtown Ayer) was agricultural land distant from the town centers of Groton and Harvard, Massachusetts. With the arrival in the 1840s of four intersecting railroads through this area, this outlying area became Groton Junction. Groton Junction experienced rapid construction with a commercial area along Main Street and residential construction in the uplands north of Main Street. This first wave of residential construction in response to the railroads was modest 1½-story, side-hall plan, gable-front houses. These clapboard-clad houses typically feature a mix of Greek Revival detailing such as corner pilasters, wide friezes and gable-end cornice returns with Italianate decorative brackets at the entrance.

# B. Properties Recommended for Listing on the National Register of Historic Places

One individual building is recommended as eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

5 Nashua Street: Benjamin F. and Caroline E. Taft House, AYE.297

The Benjamin F. Taft and Caroline E. Taft House is an excellent representative example of residential architecture constructed in Groton Junction in response to the arrival of the railroads. The gable-front building's modest size, Greek Revival and Italianate styling, and frame construction are an excellent example of these styles. The building retains a very high level of architectural integrity and is in excellent condition. The building is recommended as eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C as a physical example of the town's rapid expansion in the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century.

It is also recommended that one existing historic district be expanded with the inclusion of the Ayer Post Office (AYE.12)

 Main Street Historic District, listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1989 NRDIS 3/16/1989.

It appears that the post office was not included in the historic district solely due to its age; the building was less than 50 years of age at the time of nomination. The Ayer Post Office is a representative example of Colonial Revival post office design of its time, retains a high level of integrity, and contributes to the streetscape.
