Dear Mr. Pontbriand,

As you are aware, the Police Department Deputy Chief position has been vacant since July 2021, when I became Chief. I am excited to announce my recommendation for the next Deputy Chief of the Ayer Police Department, **Jennifer D. Bigelow**.

Jennifer was selected from five candidates who participated in a multi-prong evaluative process, one of which being an assessment center designed by a 3rd party consultant. The assessors evaluated the candidates on the following dimensions: Communication, Initiative and Decisiveness, Leadership, Problem Analysis and Decision Making, Planning and Organization, Cultural Competence and Proficiency, Development of Subordinates, Integrity, and Team Building. At the conclusion of the assessment center, Jennifer was classified as "<u>Highly Qualified to Assume Deputy Chief Duties</u>".

Jennifer has been in Law Enforcement for over 17 years, and with the Ayer Police Department for over 14 years. For the last 9 years, she has been assigned as the Ayer PD School Resource Officer, a position she grew from its inception. While the SRO, Jennifer has formed strong and trusted relationships with the children she has led and the community she has served ardently. As a resident of nearby Groton, she is known to stop by school and community events in Ayer on her own time, often with her family.

She holds a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from Westfield State University and is currently enrolled in a Master's of Public Administration Degree program at Anna Maria College. Along with many investigatory, DARE and SRO related certifications, Jennifer has completed multiple supervisory, command and executive leadership classes and is the recipient of the coveted FBI-LEEDA Leadership Trilogy Award.

As a testament to the positive impact Jennifer has made in the community and through professional channels, I am submitting several letters of recommendation. Not surprisingly, these recommendations all painted the same picture of her, using words and phrases like "professional", "dedicated", "committed", "compassionate", "respected", "trusted" and "community" centric. If I were to write a letter of recommendation for Jennifer, I would use these same words to try and describe her devotion to the profession and the community as well.

I am very enthusiastic for this next chapter in the Ayer Police Department and the opportunity to lead it into the future with Jennifer.





What is the 'MBTA Communities Act'" MGL Chapter 40A, Sec. 3A?

- Legislation to address Mass. housing shortage by ensuring that **zoning** around MBTA transit stops provides for multi-family housing at a certain density.
- Requirements differ depending on the type of MBTA service in a city or town.
- In Ayer's case, we're a 'Commuter Rail' community.
- The legislation and admin. rules address housing capacity under Zoning. The MBTA Communities Act does not require a certain number of MF Housing units to be produced. It's not a housing production plan.






Commuter Rail Community Standards from draft Guidelines

- Multi-Family (MF) Zoning districts must be of a 'reasonable size' (min. of 50 acres) with housing at ...
- A Gross Density of 15 units per acre.
- Housing allowed under zoning cannot be age restricted or prohibit children.
- MF housing districts must be within one-half (1/2) mile of the commuter rail station, though some outlying districts that otherwise meet the density requirements and are linked to the commuter rail station may be permissible (West Ayer Village FBC district as an example).

Deadlines, Timelines and Actions

- April 5, 2022: Deadline for DLTA Technical Assistance Grants from the RPCs. Ayer submitted an application for assistance with analysis and mapping of potential districts on April 4.
- May 2, 2022: Deadline for each community to submit online 'MBTA Community Information Form'. Must be submitted after presentation to Select Board (April 19).
- December 31, 2022: Communities submit an '<u>Action Plan</u>' or 'Request for Compliance' Determination. Action Plan details how each community plans to meet the requirements of the MBTA Communities Act.
- July 2023: Action Plans reviewed and approved by Mass. DHCD.
- December 31, <u>2024</u>: Commuter Rail communities must have adopted zoning consistent with MBTA Communities by this date.



How is Ayer likely to fare under these requirements?

Fairly well, due to:

- 1. Downtown Ayer / Park St. FBC District (no min. lot size, density of units limited by building space, likely exceeds 15 units per acre).
- 2. West Main Village FBC (3/4 miles)
- General Residence district allows up to
 12 units per acre gross density.
- 4. Analysis under the DLTA technical assistance grant will help us determine exactly where we stand in terms of allowable gross density and help us identify potential 'MBTA districts'.


- Purchased for \$225,000

- The transmission not easily repaired

- NFPA 1901 recommends replacement after 25 years of service (2018)


- Purchase and equip cost of \$805,000
- Mirror the design and layout of the 2020 EMAX
- Power plant, lighting, and pump meeting current NFPA standards
- Replacement allows for continued Versik (ISO) rating calculation (2024)
- Fire department deployment requires two pumpers



Why do we need two engines?

Standard Fire Attack

- First engine to the fire scene
 - Initiate Size-up
 - Rescue and or fire suppression
- Aerial to front of the building
 - Sets ladders for rescue, fire fighting, and ventilation
 - Ventilation and forcible entry
- Second engine establishes a water supply
 - Forward or reverse hose lay
 - Boosts hydrant pressure



Initial Water Supply 750 gallons of tank water

Attack Pump

- 1 ¾" handline flows 150 GPM
 - 5 minutes of constant flow
 - 5-10 minutes of working time
- 2 ½" handline flows 300 GPM
 - 2.5 minutes of constant flow
 - 3-5 minutes of working time

Supply Pump With 5" Hose

- Efficient carrying capacity of 2,000 GPM
- Boosts hydrant pressure
- Connect inline for long distance relays

The Town of Ayer Select Board is pleased to forward this Letter of Support for the Massachusetts Office of Energy & Environmental Affairs Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness Grant application, which if awarded would fund the: "Main Streets Regional Pocket Forests Pilot Project" for the neighborhoods of Ayer and Devens; as administered by the Ayer Office of Community & Economic Development and the Devens Enterprise Commission.

The Ayer/Devens Neighborhood Pocket Forest Pilot Project builds upon the Town of Ayer (2017) Master Plan, the (2019) Ayer Open Space & Recreation Plan, the Town of Ayer's (January 2020) Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness "Community Resiliency Building Workshops & Forums", the resulting (June 2020) "Ayer MVP Resiliency Summary of Findings Report", and the recently completed Town of Ayer (December 2021) Town of Ayer "Street Tree" Standard Inventory Analysis & Management Plan.

The proposed Ayer/Devens Neighborhood "Pocket Forest" Pilot Project would engage local residents within neighborhoods that are located in close proximity to historic freight railroad lines & trucking routes, that through time have lost their neighborhood street shade trees, that have been excessively covered with expansive asphalt surfaces creating unhealthy and increasingly dangerous "neighborhood heat islands", that are subjected to constant poor air-quality, and that are increasingly vulnerable to neighborhood street stormwater flooding impact. The Ayer/Devens neighbors will work together with local municipal staff and project consultants to guide, plan, design, and plant new native trees in selected neighborhood locations in order to establish and assure a better, healthier, safer, and more resilient quality of life for the residents and neighbors of these more urbanized, compact and traditionally working-class neighborhoods.

In closing, the Town of Ayer Select Board is hopeful that the Massachusetts Office of Energy & Environmental Affairs (MVP Program) will award the Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness Grant for the proposed "Ayer/Devens Neighborhood Pocket Forests Pilot Project" application, as we are confident of a successful local program outcome and a noteworthy model project for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

1. 2022 through 2024 Paving and Road Treatment Contract Award –

Bids for 2022 through 2024 Road Paving and Treatment were opened on April 8, 2022. This is for Chapter 90 projects and includes paving and sealing of roads. The contract is awarded for one year with the option of extending the contract for two additional years. We received 4 bids for the road paving portion of the contract and PJ Albert Inc. of Fitchburg, MA is the low bidder. The Contract also had separate bid items for specialized pavement treatment preservations. We received 1 bid for rubberized chip seal from All States Construction, Inc.

We recommend awarding the road paving contract to PJ Albert Inc. and the rubberized chip seal preservation contract to All States Construction, Inc.

Requested Motion – Vote to award the road paving contract to PJ Albert Inc. and the rubberized chip seal contract to All States Construction, Inc for FY23.

2. Woodlawn Cemetery Regulations and Fees –

The Woodlawn Cemetery is now under ownership and operation of the Town. I'm requesting the Select Board adopt regulations and fees for the Woodlawn Cemetery.

AGREEMENT (EJCDC)

THIS AGREEMENT is by and be	tween The Town of Ayer, Massachusetts	(hereinafter called OWNER) and
P.J. Albert, Inc.	hereinafter called CONTRACTOR).	

OWNER and CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - WORK

1.01 CONTRACTOR shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

The work will consist of Road Paving and Treatment for one year with the Owner's option to extend the contract for two additional one-year periods.

ARTICLE 2 - CONTRACT TIMES

- 4.01 Time of the Essence
- A. All time limits for Milestones, if any, Substantial Completion, and completion and readiness for final payment as stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence of the Contract.
- 4.02 Liquidated Damages
- A. CONTRACTOR and OWNER recognize that time is of the essence of this Agreement and that OWNER will suffer financial loss if the Work is not completed within the times specified in paragraph 4.02 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with Article 12 of the General Conditions. The parties also recognize the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving in a legal or arbitration proceeding the actual loss suffered by OWNER if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, OWNER and CONTRACTOR agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty), CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER \$ 500 for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 4.02 for Substantial Completion until the Work is substantially complete. After Substantial Completion, if CONTRACTOR shall neglect, refuse, or fail to complete the remaining Work within the Contract Time or any proper extension thereof granted by OWNER, CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER \$ 500 for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 4.02 for completion and readiness for final payment until the Work is completed and ready for final payment.

ARTICLE 5 - CONTRACT PRICE

5.01 OWNER shall pay CONTRACTOR for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents an amount in current funds equal to the sum of the amounts determined pursuant to paragraphs 5.01.A below:

A. For all Work, at the prices stated in CONTRACTOR's Bid, attached hereto as an exhibit.

ARTICLE 6 - PAYMENT PROCEDURES

- 6.01 Progress Payments; Retainage
- A. OWNER shall make progress payments on account of the Contract Price on the basis of CONTRACTOR's Applications for Payment on or about the last day of each month during performance of the Work as provided in paragraphs 6.01.A.1 and 6.01.A.2 below.
 - 1. Prior to Substantial Completion, progress payments will be made in an amount equal to the percentage indicated below but, in each case, less the aggregate of payments previously made and less such amounts as ENGINEER may determine or OWNER may withhold:
 - a. 95 % of Work completed (with the balance being retainage).

- b. 95 % of cost of materials and equipment not incorporated in the Work (with the balance being retainage).
- 2. Upon Substantial Completion, OWNER shall pay an amount sufficient to increase total payments to CONTRACTOR to 95 % of the Work completed, less such amounts as ENGINEER shall determine and less 95 % of ENGINEER's estimate of the value of Work to be completed or corrected as shown on the tentative list of items to be completed or corrected attached to the certificate of Substantial Completion.

6.02 Final Payment

A. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work OWNER shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by ENGINEER.

ARTICLE 7 - OMITTED

ARTICLE 8 - CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 8.01 In order to induce OWNER to enter into this Agreement CONTRACTOR makes the following representations:
- A. CONTRACTOR has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents and the other related data identified in the Bidding Documents.
- B. CONTRACTOR has visited the Site and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- C. CONTRACTOR is familiar with and is satisfied as to all federal, state, and local Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- D. CONTRACTOR does not consider that any further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.
- E. CONTRACTOR is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by OWNER and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.
- F. CONTRACTOR has correlated the information known to CONTRACTOR, information and observations obtained from visits to the Site, reports and drawings identified in the Contract Documents, and all additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, and data with the Contract Documents.
- G. CONTRACTOR has given ENGINEER written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that CONTRACTOR has discovered in the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by ENGINEER is acceptable to CONTRACTOR.
- H. The Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.

ARTICLE 9 - OMITTED

ARTICLE 10 - MISCELLANEOUS

10.01 Terms

- A. Terms used in this Agreement will have the meanings as specified.
- 10.02 Assignment of Contract

A. No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and, specifically but without limitation, moneys that may become due and moneys that are due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

10.03 Successors and Assigns

A. OWNER and CONTRACTOR each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

10.04 Severability

A. Any provision or part of the Contract Documents held to be void or unenforceable under any Law or Regulation shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon OWNER and CONTRACTOR, who agree that the Contract Documents shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

10.05 Other Provision

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, OWNER and CONTRACTOR have signed this Agreement in duplicate. One counterpart each has been delivered to OWNER and CONTRACTOR. All portions of the Contract Documents have been signed or identified by OWNER and CONTRACTOR or on their behalf.

OWNER and CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - WORK

1.01 CONTRACTOR shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

The work will consist of Road Paving and Treatment for one year with the Owner's option to extend the contract for two additional one-year periods.

ARTICLE 2 - CONTRACT TIMES

- 4.01 Time of the Essence
- A. All time limits for Milestones, if any, Substantial Completion, and completion and readiness for final payment as stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence of the Contract.
- 4.02 Liquidated Damages
- A. CONTRACTOR and OWNER recognize that time is of the essence of this Agreement and that OWNER will suffer financial loss if the Work is not completed within the times specified in paragraph 4.02 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with Article 12 of the General Conditions. The parties also recognize the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving in a legal or arbitration proceeding the actual loss suffered by OWNER if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, OWNER and CONTRACTOR agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty), CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER \$ 500 for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 4.02 for Substantial Completion until the Work is substantially complete. After Substantial Completion, if CONTRACTOR shall neglect, refuse, or fail to complete the remaining Work within the Contract Time or any proper extension thereof granted by OWNER, CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER \$ 500 for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 4.02 for completion and readiness for final payment until the Work is completed and ready for final payment.

ARTICLE 5 - CONTRACT PRICE

5.01 OWNER shall pay CONTRACTOR for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents an amount in current funds equal to the sum of the amounts determined pursuant to paragraphs 5.01.A below:

Upon Substantial Completion, OWNER shall pay an amount sufficient to increase total payments to CONTRACTOR to 95 % of the Work completed, less such amounts as ENGINEER shall determine and less 95 % of ENGINEER's estimate of the value of Work to be completed or corrected as shown on the tentative list of items to be completed or corrected attached to the certificate of Substantial Completion.

6.02 Final Payment

A. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work OWNER shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by ENGINEER.

ARTICLE 7 - OMITTED

ARTICLE 8 - CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 8.01 In order to induce OWNER to enter into this Agreement CONTRACTOR makes the following representations:
- A. CONTRACTOR has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents and the other related data identified in the Bidding Documents.
- B. CONTRACTOR has visited the Site and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- C. CONTRACTOR is familiar with and is satisfied as to all federal, state, and local Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- D. CONTRACTOR does not consider that any further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.
- E. CONTRACTOR is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by OWNER and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.
- F. CONTRACTOR has correlated the information known to CONTRACTOR, information and observations obtained from visits to the Site, reports and drawings identified in the Contract Documents, and all additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, and data with the Contract Documents.
- G. CONTRACTOR has given ENGINEER written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that CONTRACTOR has discovered in the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by ENGINEER is acceptable to CONTRACTOR.
- H. The Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.

10.01 Terms

- A. Terms used in this Agreement will have the meanings as specified.
- 10.02 Assignment of Contract

A. No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and, specifically but without limitation, moneys that may become due and moneys that are due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

10.03 Successors and Assigns

A. OWNER and CONTRACTOR each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

10.04 Severability

A. Any provision or part of the Contract Documents held to be void or unenforceable under any Law or Regulation shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon OWNER and CONTRACTOR, who agree that the Contract Documents shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

10.05 Other Provision

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, OWNER and CONTRACTOR have signed this Agreement in duplicate. One counterpart each has been delivered to OWNER and CONTRACTOR. All portions of the Contract Documents have been signed or identified by OWNER and CONTRACTOR or on their behalf.

Genera	al Regulations
(Effective Date)

The purpose of Woodlawn Cemetery is for the burial of human remains. When purchasing cemetery lots you are purchasing the right to bury human remains in the cemetery. Perpetual care must also be purchased for the maintenance of the lots. Ownership of the property remains with the Town of Ayer.

- 1. Lots may be purchased by past and present residents of Ayer.
- 2. All purchasers of lots shall also pay a fee for perpetual care of said lots. Perpetual care consists only of mowing and trimming the grass.
- 3. One monument above ground will be allowed per deed. Grave markers are to be a ground level. Raised lots, bark mulch, lot boarders, crushed stone, etc. are not permitted.
- 4. No grading of lots, seeding, removal of shrubs or trees, placing of memorials or other work may be done without the approval of the Town of Ayer. Written requests for such modifications must be submitted to the Ayer Department of Public Works (DPW) for approval.
- 5. No work will be performed on lots by any individual on which there remains an unpaid bill.
- 6. Wreaths, floral arrangements and plants may be placed on the burial side of the monument with growth not to exceed the width of the monument or to protrude more than 18 inches from the base of the monument. Exception being, if a monument is placed in the middle of multiple grave lots with graves in front and in back of the monument, plantings may be on both sides of the monument as specified above. It is the responsibility of the family or representative to remove these items before they fade or become unsightly.
- 7. Implements and all waste materials must not be left on lots, paths or driveways and must be removed without delay.
- 8. No new trees or shrubs shall be permitted on lots.
- 9. Existing trees or shrubs will be no higher than 24 inches, nor extend beyond the boundaries of the lot and will be maintained by the deed holder.
- 10. If, in the opinion of the Ayer DPW, any tree, shrub, or other object(s) is deemed unsightly, detrimental, or not in keeping with the regulations of Woodlawn Cemetery, the deed holder, heir or representative will be notified to remove said items. These items must be removed within 30 days.
- 11. In the event that the Ayer DPW must take action to restore a lot to cemetery regulations, all expenses incurred will be the responsibility of the deed holder.
- 12. In the event that the Ayer DPW is unable to locate the deed holder, heir or representative of the lot in question within 30 days, the Ayer DPW shall have authority to make necessary modifications.
- 13. No other person shall be allowed to alter any avenue, way or path or others grounds.
- 14. Firearms or other weapons shall not be discharged in the cemetery except on the occasion of a military funeral.



- 15. Heavy loads shall not be permitted transport through the cemetery.
- 16. Driving shall be permitted only upon the driveways and at a rate no faster than a walk.
- 17. Only "AIDE ANIMALS" will be permitted on the grounds of Woodlawn Cemetery.
- 18. Lots designated for ashes will have grave markers at ground level.
- 19. The Town of Ayer shall not be responsible for any damage or loss to items left on the lots, or articles removed from the cemetery for non-conformity.
- 20. The Town of Ayer has full discretion to maintain Woodlawn Cemetery with integrity and respect for all those who share this cemetery as their final resting place.
