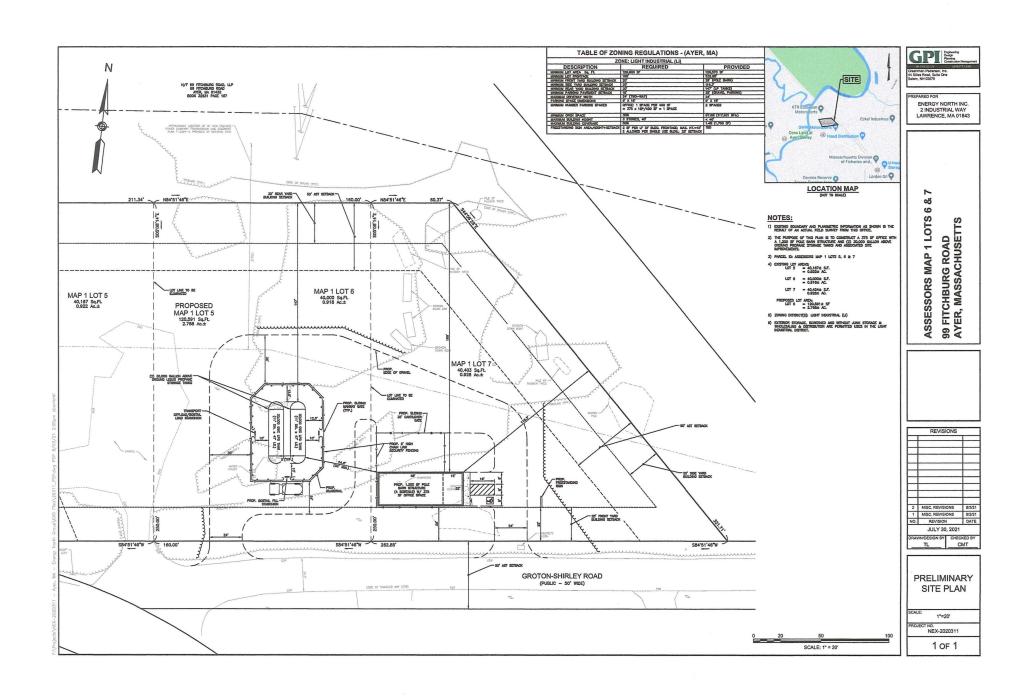

1. **Main Street TIP Project Update and Request for Letter of Support** – Based on internal design meetings with Town officials and our engineering consultant, the preferred street design is for wider sidewalks with shared bike lanes as opposed to narrow sidewalks with dedicated bike lanes. If the Town moves forward with the preferred street design, a design exception must be obtained from MassDOT, per TIP design requirements.
