Appointed Boards & Committees

The **Ayer Affordable Housing Committee** works toward guiding the process of creating more affordable housing opportunities in the community. The Committee has created and will work with the **Ayer Affordable Housing Trust Board**. Both groups hold 7 members.

The **Ayer Cultural Council's** mission is to promote, nurture and maintain the vitality of the cultural resources within the Ayer community. With the annual grant from the State, our role is to distribute the funding appropriately to support various activities that would enhance cultural awareness in the Ayer community. This committee holds 9 members.

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) was designed as a smart growth tool to help with four general types of projects: the acquisition and preservation of open space; the creation and support of affordable housing; the acquisition and preservation of historic resources; and the creation and support of outdoor recreational uses. This committee holds 7 members.

The **Commission on Disabilities** promotes the inclusion and integration of persons with disabilities in the actives, services and employment opportunities of the Town of Ayer. This committee holds 8 members.

The responsibility of the **Finance Committee** is to act in the best interest of the taxpayer. The committee's primary responsibility is to present a balanced budget for Annual Town Meeting which provides an efficient use of available funds by maximizing revenue streams and ensuring expenses are quantified. This committee holds 5 members.

The **Rate Review Committee** is appointed by the Select Board and is charged with reviewing annually the Town's water, sewer, and transfer station rates and making formal rate recommendations to the Select Board. The Rate Review Committee meets on a quarterly basis at the Ayer Town Hall. This committee holds 9 members.

The **Zoning Board of Appeals** (ZBA) has the authority to approve variances from the requirements of the Zoning Bylaw and to hear and adjudicate appeals from any decision made by the Building Commissioner pertaining to a specific property. The ZBA also reviews special permit applications pursuant to the Ayer Zoning Bylaw. This board holds 5 members with 4 alternates.

Elected Boards & Committees

The **Board of Assessors** is responsible for determining the fair and equitable value of all property within the Town for the purpose of taxation. The Board also has the authority to grant abatements on all Property Tax, including Motor Vehicle Excise Tax. This board holds 3 members.

The Ayer Shirley Regional School District operates according to policies established by the **Ayer Shirley Regional School Committee.** The Committee then appraises the effects of its policies and makes revisions as necessary. This committee holds 3 members.

The **Board of Health** implements and oversees the policies and regulations as mandated by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and the Department of Environmental Protection. This board holds 3 members.

The **Ayer Library Board of Trustees** is the governing body of the Ayer Library, as established by the Massachusetts State Legislature via the Library's 1894 Act of Incorporation and as amended in 1991. The Trustees approve library policies and procedures, and oversee all library operations. This board holds 9 members.

The **Park Commission** is charged with the responsibility of seeing to the recreational needs of the Town by providing clean and well groomed park and beach facilities as well as safe, appealing recreational programs for members of the community. This board holds 5 members.

The **Planning Board** is responsible for enforcing and amending the Zoning Bylaws and District Map. The Planning Board reviews all subdivision plans for compliance with zoning and subdivision requirements. This board holds 5 members.

The **Select Board** is a three-person board of officials elected by the people of Ayer. The Board serves as the chief elected authority for the Town. This board holds 3 members.

Guide to Town Hall Departments

ASSESSOR

The Town Assessor works in conjunction with the Board of Assessors and is responsible for determining the fair and equitable value of all property within the Town for the purpose of taxation. Questions pertaining to the assessment on Real Estate, Personal Property, or Motor Vehicle Excise, or regarding exemptions available to senior citizens, veterans, and others, should be directed to the Assessor's office. Basic information on the assessment process, excise tax, abatements, as well as forms to change a mailing address or apply for tax relief are available online at www.ayer.ma.us/assessor.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

The Ayer Building Department is responsible for administering Massachusetts General Laws, Building, Electrical, Plumbing and Gas Codes, Architectural Access Board regulations, and General and Zoning Bylaws of the Town of Ayer as they relate to demolition, construction, reconstruction, and occupancy of buildings and structures. The Building Department conducts supervisory and inspection work related to the enforcement and interpretation of the state building code, the local zoning bylaw and other applicable regulations. Many home improvement activities require a permit from the building department before work can begin. If you are unsure if work requires a permit, please contact the Building Department and we will be glad to assist, or check the Building Department webpage for more information. www.ayer.ma.us/building-department.

ECONOMIC & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The Ayer Office of Community & Economic Development (AOCED) is focused on visioning, cultivating, and sustaining a healthy, connective, and vibrant local/regional economic climate equally benefiting business-owners and employees, on designing and investing in strong neighborhoods, and on assuring broad local housing opportunity and choice for all residents. The AOCED strives to maintain and grow a diversified tax base and housing stock that well-positions the Town of Ayer to socio-economically compete and sustainably grow within the 21st century economy. TREASURER/TAX COLLECTOR

The Treasurer/Tax Collectors' office is responsible for billing and collection of Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicle Taxes, Municipal Lien Certificate Requests, Tax Title liens and Collections through to the foreclosure process, Receiving and maintaining custody of all Town of Ayer funds, investing the Town of Ayer funds, insuring their safety, liquidity and yield, and borrowing and debt service. TOWN CLERK

The Town Clerk's office is often considered the doorway to local government. The Town Clerk's office serves as the central information point for residents and visitors alike. The Town Clerk is the chief election official, recording official, registrar of vital records, and licensing officer. The Town Clerk oversees the polling place and the conduct of all elections and election-related activity, and records all actions of Town Meetings. The Clerk's Office maintains the municipal code, the official Town bulletin board, oaths of office, appointments and resignations of all Town Officials. The Clerk's office issues state licenses and permits, including marriage licenses, business licenses (DBA), dog licenses, raffle permits and certified requests for public documents. This office responds to inquiries from the public as well as from other departments, boards and committees. For more information visit www.aver.ma.us/town-clerk.

TOWN PLANNER

The Town Planner acts as the primary liaison to the public on land use, zoning, and development matters. The Town Planner reviews all development projects in conjunction with the Building Department to ensure they are compliant with the Zoning Bylaw and, if they are not, what type of zoning approvals are required (Site Plan approval, Special Permit, Variance, etc.). The Town Planner also provides technical assistance and advises Town boards and departments on issues relating to land use regulations, permitting, municipal planning, open space preservation, economic development, and affordable housing. The Veterans' Agent serves the needs of veterans and their dependents, spouses, children, and parents. Fall Clean-up Tips

It's time to start thinking about getting your yard ready for winter! Fall is the perfect time to prune existing trees and shrubs, clean up fallen leaves and sticks, and to plant flower bulbs for spring blooms. When pruning, try to leave seed heads and berries behind to provide food for birds and wildlife during the winter months. According to the USDA Plant Hardiness Zone Map, Ayer is in gardening zone 5B, which makes fall the perfect time to plant tulip, daffodil, iris, crocus, allium and snowdrop bulbs, to name a few.

What to do with all your leaves, sticks, and small branches after you're done cleaning up? Bring them right to the Transfer Station (100 Groton Harvard Rd) and dispose of your yard waste properly. This service is included with your annual Transfer Station sticker at no additional cost.

The Ayer Fire Department does not issue permits for fall brush burning.

Don't forget your Mass Health Redetermination!

Due to the federal government ending the COVID-era continuous coverage requirements on April 1, 2023, MassHealth has returned to their regular renewal processes.

MassHealth needs to renew **all** members' health coverage to ensure they still qualify for their current benefit. These renewals will take place over 12 months, from April 2023 to April 2024. Be on the lookout for your renewal forms (many in a **blue envelope**) in the mail at any time during this one-year period. For more information visit *mass.gov/masshealthrenew*.

Ayer East Main Street Neighborhood Pocket Forest

The Ayer East Main Street Neighborhood Pocket Forest Pilot Project was successfully planted in April 2023 by over 100 Ayer residents and partners. The Pocket Forest is now growing in its proper wild state with over 31 species of native New England trees, 15 native species of shrubs, 20 species of native wild flowers and ground cover, and is doing its good work to lessen unhealthful heat-island effects from too much asphalt in the old neighborhood, to improve poor air quality from heavy freight railroad lines & trucking routes running through the neighborhood, to capture more rainwater/stormwater for Ayer's precious aquifers and groundwater wells, to attract and support our threatened native pollinators, and to bring more beautiful natural life and quality to the neighborhood for the mind, body and spirit of the residents of this close-knit historic Ayer neighborhood. Two additional innovative neighborhood Pocket Forests are proposed for the Devens Community next year, and two more for Ayer in 2025.

Where to get your 2023 Fishing and Hunting Licenses

Licenses can be purchased online via www.massfishhunt.mass.gov or in person at the MassWildlife Northeast District office located at 85 Fitchburg Road, Ayer, MA. Online purchases will require payment by credit card, although new licenses, no-cost duplicate re-prints, and stamps will be immediately available and printable from your home printer.

Hunting, Fishing, and Sport Licenses are **NOT** available at the Town Clerk's office as of 2012.


Ayer made headlines twice this year in two different major news outlets!
