Do you approve of the vote of the Regional District School Committee of the Ayer Shirley Regional School District adopted on August 15, 2018, to authorize the borrowing of \$7,100,000.00 to pay costs of designing, constructing, originally equipping and furnishing a new District high school to be located at 141 Washington Street, Ayer, MA, which vote provides, in relevant part, as follows:

"VOTED: That the Ayer Shirley Regional School District (the "District") hereby appropriates the amount of \$7,100,000.00 for the purpose of paying costs of designing, constructing and equipping a new athletic complex, including, but not limited to a new artificial turf field, a new track with 8 lanes, a new plaza and concession stand with bathrooms, new bleachers and lights, upgraded soccer fields, addition of a new soccer field, a new softball field and new fencing, backstops and dugouts for softball and baseball, including the payment of all costs incidental and related thereto. Any premium received upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with Chapter 44, Section 20 of the General Laws, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount.

The debt authorized by this vote of the Committee shall be submitted to the registered voters of the District's member towns for approval at a District-wide election to be held on Saturday October 6, 2018, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 71, Section 16(n) of the General Laws and the District Agreement."
