FY 2025 Town Budget Update

The development of the Town's Budget is a public process which starts in October and culminates with Town Meeting approval of the budget in April each year. It is imperative that the public be informed about the Budget and play an active role in getting informed, asking questions, and offering public input. All FY 2025 Budget information including DRAFT budgets and budget related documents can be found on the Town's website at www.ayer.ma.us/budget. Additionally, this information is available to the public upon request to the Town Manager's Office at Town Hall during normal business hours.

As we move through the FY 2025 Budget Process, there are some key dates the public should note:

March 2024

March 27th, 6:00pm at Town Hall:

The Second Public Budget Forum at which the Town Manager will present DRAFT #3 of the FY 2025 Budget to a joint meeting of the Select Board and Finance Committee. The public is invited to attend and to ask questions and offer input. This second forum follows the same format as the January 24th forum.

April 2024

April 2nd, 6:00pm: The Select Board will finalize and approve the Annual Town Meeting Warrant which includes the FY 2025 Budget at this meeting.

April 5th: The Annual Town Meeting Warrant will be publicly posted at various public locations throughout Town and on the Town's website. The Warrant will also be sent to print and mailed to all Ayer households. Copies of the Warrant are available at the Town Manager's Office upon request during normal business hours.

April 22, 7:00pm: Annual Town Meeting in the Auditorium of the Ayer Shirley Regional High School, 141 Washington Street.

Nashoba Associated Boards of Health 2024 Pet Rabies Clinics

In conjunction with our Member Boards of Health, the Nashoba Associated Boards of Health have scheduled rabies vaccination clinics throughout the District to provide an opportunity for residents to have their dogs and cats vaccinated. We are grateful for the support we receive from the participating veterinarians to provide this valuable and important service.

All dogs and cats over six (6) months of age, those not previously immunized, and those with a blue rosette (2021) rabies tag must be immunized. The tag for 2024 will be a red heart. Depending on the vaccination status of your dog or cat the veterinarian will inform you of the expiration date for the rabies vaccine given to your pet.

* Please bring a copy of your pet's last rabies certificate if you have it * Residents of Nashoba towns may attend any clinic * * Cats must be brought in cages or closed boxes during the last half of any clinic. *

2024 Animal & Fowl Permits

Permits are due to the Ayer Board of Health Office by May 31st, 2024

- ALL animals such as chickens, cows, pigs, and goats need a permit from the Board of Health

2024 Dog Licenses

Town and state laws require that all dogs aged six (6) months and older be licensed each year. Licenses can be purchased in person at the Town Clerk's Office, by mail, and online. Proof of current rabies vaccine is required before any licenses are issued.

2024 licenses were due by March 1st, 2024. All renewal licenses are now subject to a \$50.00 late fee per household. 2024 dog tags have been advertised and available in the Town Clerk's Office since December 19th, 2023.

Late fees do not apply to dogs that were under six (6) months old and ineligible for a rabies vaccine and/or arrived to Town after the March 1st deadline.

Fees: \$10 neutered/spayed dogs; \$15 intact dogs. No Fee for seniors (70+) or service dogs

Conservation Commission—Tree Removal Policy

The Ayer Conservation Commission would like to remind homeowners that any tree removal within the 100-foot buffer zone from a wetland (including ponds) or 200-foot buffer zone from a river must be reviewed by the Conservation Agent for approval. Trees and other vegetation play in important role in protecting our water bodies and keeping our properties cool in the summer and warmer in the winter.

The Conservation Commission developed a Tree Removal Policy at the end of 2022 which outlines the guidelines for residents that wish to have a tree removed from their property. The guidelines are in place to help residents understand the process, allow for hazardous trees to be removed while minimally disturbing wildlife, and to request new trees or shrubs be planted when applicable.

Stormwater Utility Advisory Workgroup

Ayer, like other municipalities across the country, confronts the need to repair or replace aging infrastructure essential to our daily lives. Among these are multiple culverts - structures that safely direct water under roads and/or sidewalks - that need immediate attention. According to Mass.gov's Resilient Mass projections our state can expect an additional 1-6 inches of annual rainfall by 2050, dramatically increasing the possibility of catastrophic damage and expensive repairs.

To meet the need for responsible action and conform to more stringent EPA and state regulations, the Town's Department of Public Works, under the leadership of Director Dan Van Schalwyk, has formed a Stormwater Utility Advisory Workgroup to review action plans and potential funding structures for Ayer. The Goal: To present a practical, equitable plan for a Stormwater Utility Fund at Fall Town Meeting in October.

Springtime Outdoor Walking & Cycling Destinations in Ayer

The Historic Hill District Neighborhood: Planned and laid-out between 1858-1870, this is one of Ayer's most architecturally distinctive, walkable, bikeable, and fascinating historic residential neighborhoods - located in the heart of your township. As you stroll, pause and observe the noteworthy types of architectural styles of the grand homesteads that line Washington Street and many side streets including, Greek Revival, Italianate, Gothic Revival, Queen Anne, Gothic Stick, Dutch Colonial, Colonial Revival, Craftsman, Moderne, and conventional. And of course, it's the concentration of traditional homestead "front porches" that create the special experience of encountering, conversing, visiting and connecting between the front porch and the sidewalk with the neighbors of Ayer's Historic Hill District Neighborhood. The Historic Hill District Neighborhood also is the home to some of Ayer's impressive, precious, and massive "old growth" neighborhood trees – walk, explore and you will encounter the massive old growth Beech Trees at 53 & 37 Washington St., the American Sycamore at 60 Washington St., the Conifer at 29 Washington St., and the great Oak at 95 Washington St.

The Oxbow National Wildlife Refuge/The Nashua Riverfront: It comes as a surprise to some folks from Ayer and beyond, that here you can visit, experience, and enjoy a genuine National Wildlife Refuge just a short walk, bicycle-ride, and/or canoe/kayak trip away. View a map of Ayer and you will see that the majestic and gently-northward flowing Nashua River makes up the entire western boundary of the Town of Ayer. Yes, the Town of Ayer is a riverfront community! The great Oxbow National Wildlife Refuge offers five-miles of hiking trails along the riverfront, where you can observe, hear and explore the natural habitat of countless migratory birds, waterfowl, mammals, native pollinators, reptiles, and don't forget the great fishing. The US Fish & Wildlife Service manage the National Wildlife Refuge. Access the Oxbow National Wildlife Refuge by parking at "The Triangle Pollinator Garden" on MacPherson Rd. in Ayer and/or the Bill Ashe Visitor Facility & Canoe Launch at 80 Hospital Rd. in Devens. The Nashua River was designated as a National Wild & Scenic River in 2021. This wonderful natural refuge was created and is maintained to ensure the survival of native wildlife species – right here in your Town of Ayer. Experience the "refuge" with your family, friends, visitors and neighbors this Spring!

The Pine Meadow Pond Conservation Trails: Hiking the unspoiled 125-acre New England woodland terrain, topography, geology, hydrology, wildlife habitat, flora, fauna, and natural serenity of Ayer's Pine Meadow Pond Conservation Trails is sure to be one of your most healthful, invigorating and memorable springtime local experiences. Located at the geographic center of Ayer, the majestic and expansive woodland of comfortably hilly terrain and ancient glacial granite outcroppings framed by the calming backdrop of Pine Meadow Pond (Upper Flannagan's Pond) provides Ayer residents and visitors with a world-class eco-tourism experience and Springtime natural escape right in the heart of your busy little township. The Pine Meadow Conservation Trails are publicly accessed at Groton-Harvard Rd. and Oak Ridge Drive. Bring the kids, bring the dog, bring the grandparents, bring your friends – and immerse yourself in the beauty and tranquility of the natural world in Ayer. Ayer's Pine Meadow Pond Conservation Trails are good for your mind and body, especially in the Spring!

The Historic Woodlawn Cemetery Monumental Architecture Walk: Ayer's Historic Woodlawn Cemetery on Harvard Rd. was established in 1868, although there are believed to be older burials at the sacred site. The Cemetery existed before Ayer was chartered as a township in 1871, and at a time when the location of the Cemetery was the ancient Colonial center of the village of South Groton. The Colonial village center later known as "Old Common" was completely obliterated with the construction of the "Rotary" (the Fredrick Carlton Circle) in 1941 by US Army - however, the ancient and fascinating Cemetery survived the coming of the Rotary. Woodlawn Cemetery makes for a unique and meaningful Springtime walking/bicycling exploration and visitation. Here you will discover an impressive assembly of noteworthy memorial stone architectural types and artfulness. This is the "architecture of the afterlife" – showing many examples of masterful granite and marble stone symbolic carving including, a finger pointed towards Heaven, the oak leaf (long life), the lamb (loss of a child), the weeping willow (sorrow), the broken column (young life cut short), and many more. Make a point of locating the "broken Roman column" monument of Capt. Leander King who made the supreme sacrifice at the Battle of Gettysburg in 1863. Enjoy your time visiting so many of the old Ayer families and family members that eternally rest here together – it is not a somber experience, but joyful to visit those who have come before us. At the rear-center portion Woodlawn Cemetery you will discover rows of uniform white grave memorials dating from the WWI – this is the fascinating and powerful National Cemetery Administration Soldier's Lot; take some time to explore this special Ayer heritage destination place this Spring.

Don't forget your MassHealth Redetermination!

Due to the federal government ending the COVID-era continuous coverage requirements on April 1, 2023, MassHealth has returned to their regular renewal processes.

Up until April 2023, due to the federal public health emergency, federal rules allowed people to keep their MassHealth coverage even if their circumstances changed. On April 1, 2023, MassHealth began redetermining eligibility for all 2.4 million enrollees. These redeterminations will continue through April 2024. Moving forward, as was the case before the public health emergency, MassHealth will require renewals on an annual basis.

Massachusetts law requires everyone to have health insurance, and the Commonwealth continues to lead the nation with more that 97% of residents covered.

Be on the lookout for your renewal forms (many in a **blue envelope**) in the mail at any time during this one -year period. For more information visit mass.gov/masshealthrenew.
