Administration

- Coordination, submittal review and oversight for High School Utility Corridor project and NVMC Project
- Continued GIS Utility mapping with MRPC
- Prepared and advertised RFP for Water Meter Automated Read System
- Designed and bid Crabtree Wastewater Pumping Station Replacement Project
- Prepared bid package for Main St Street Light Improvements
- compared and condensed Water and Sewer accounts with assessors data base to begin development
 of Stormwater Utility billing system
- Public meetings for Victor Drive Culvert project and Organics to Energy project
- Presented Ayer's energy savings activities at DOER Energy Leaders Seminar
- Implemented electronic hydrant, catch basin and storm drain outfall reporting
- Developed plan for online payment of water and sewer bills
- Sent out water and sewer bills and sold trash bags and transfer station stickers

Highway Division

- Worked with ASRSD to paint parking lot lines and other traffic lines and constructed additional parking area for 18 cars.
- Worked with Ayer PD to install Pedestrian Crossing signage at 4 locations in Town
- Replaced traffic signs at multiple locations
- Installed drainage improvements at Washington St / Groton Harvard Rd intersection
- Installed 200 feet of new drain pipe in Sandy Pond Rd
- Graded and paved Washington Street from ASRHS to Nashoba Valley Regional Hospital
- Repaired / rebuilt catch basins
- Truck H13 was sandblasted and painted
- Preparing sanders and plows for winter
- New fence at Balch Pond Dam and spread loam at triangle area
- Filled ruts and potholes in road shoulders on Barnum and Harvard Rds
- Painted exterior doors at DPW Admin Office
- Performed beaver dam debris removal at the usual locations
- Mowing and brush cutting at Rotary, Town Hall, Police Station, rail-trail and roadways
- Weed Wacking on main roads in town
- Equipment and vehicle maintenance
- Trash pickup at multiple locations in town

Water Division

- Grove Pond WTP Upgrade Project Contractor is constructing the Water Treatment Plant Building Addition and project site work. Water Department installed an8-inch insertion valve to allow for easier shut-down and is coordinating activities with contractor.
- Assisted Nashoba Valley Community Hospital with repair of water main break, caused by contractor and with resulting water quality issue.
- Completed and started up new chlorine feed system at Spec Pond WTP
- Painted chemical feed are, loading dock and floors at Spec Pond WTP
- Replaced hydrants on Groton School Rd, Rosewood Ave and Shirley St.
- Continued hydrant inventory and inspections
- Replaced motor at well #1 at Grove Pond WTP
- Begin Lead and Copper sampling town-wide
- Completed required DEP monthly coliform and chlorine sampling
- Completed meter readings, meter replacements and assisted customers with leak evaluations
- Completed DIGSAFE requests
- Normal water treatment duties including daily testing and reports, chemical adjustments, equipment maintenance

Wastewater Division

- Wastewater Treatment Plant is operating efficiently and producing very good effluent
- Drained, cleaned and performed maintenance on the two aeration basins at the WWTP Blowers are running much more efficiently
- Completed sewer jetting and inspection of East End sewers and started on Hill section
- Installed flow monitoring equipment for West Main Street Pumping Station evaluation
- Inspections of sewer installations at ASRHS, Barnum Rd, Pingry Subdivision and NVMC
- TV inspection and hydro-jetting of sewers at various location
- Completed wastewater safety review
- Tested and serviced all generators
- Performed daily inspections of wastewater pumping stations
- Performed daily operations, laboratory testing and reporting for WWTP
- Hauled sludge to Upper Blackstone Sanitary District (Millbury)

Solid Waste Division

- Normal transfer station operations including site clean-up, organization and monthly reports
- Brush chipping and leaf hauling to brush dump / compost area off Bishop Road
