Re: May Monthly Report

During the month of May 2015 the Police Department logged 798 events requiring 56 incident reports and 13 arrest reports. We assisted the Fire Department on 61 medicals and 20 fire alarms. Here are some of the highlights:

At our monthly School Safety Team Meeting we focused on finalizing the District's Crisis Intervention & Response Guide. The guide will be put together over the summer and ready for the opening day of school in September.
