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MONTHLY REPORT SELECTMEN FIRE DEPARTMENT JUNE 2015

- June 2nd there was a meeting held at the Fire Station with two Project Specialists from FEMA on the process for submission of a reimbursement package for the declared disaster from last winter's blizzards. This meeting was attended by members of the Department of Public Works and Fire Department. A project worksheet has been submitted to FEMA in the amount of \$90,621.46. The Town should receive 75% of this amount as a reimbursement. I am waiting for a contract to be issued from FEMA for this reimbursement.
- June 26th the Fire Department participated in a mass casualty drill at Nashoba Hospital. The incident was held in Groton with patients being transported to Nashoba Valley Medical Center. The patients were decontaminated using the Ayer Fire Department Mass Decontamination Unit before entering the emergency room. This is a yearly drill designed to protect the hospital emergency room from contamination due to a chemical or biological incident. The surge capacity of the hospital emergency room is tested. Several Towns participated by providing ambulances to transport patients.
- The new Rescue #1 is being built at Emergency One in Ocala Florida. The truck is almost completed and should be in Massachusetts at Greenwood Fire Apparatus, the local dealer by the middle of July. Once it is at Greenwood there is tool mounting and lettering to be completed before the department can take delivery. I am expecting the new Rescue to be delivered sometime in late August.
