During the month of July 2016 the Police Department logged 815 events requiring 39 incident reports and 13 arrest reports. We assisted the Fire Department on 74 medicals and 21 fire alarms. Here are some of the highlights:

Radio Follow-up: All plans are on hold until a funding source can be located to complete the project. It was anticipated that the use of UDAG funding would be sought but with a moratorium placed on this source it is not available. We will be making a presentation to the BOS in the coming months in hopes of bringing a request to the Fall Town Meeting. In the mean time we continue to be plagued with radio functionality and reception issues that continue to mean an unsafe working environment for the officers.

The July 4th celebration for the most part was a success on our end with no major incidents. We felt this year that traffic exited at the end quicker than it has in past years which may be attributable to modifications in traffic patterns and a lower attendance.
