Re: October Monthly Report

During the month of October 2016 the Police Department logged 681 events requiring 36 incident reports and 9 arrest reports. We assisted the Fire Department on 52 medicals and 20 fire alarms. Here are some of the highlights:

Radio Follow-up: Through the grace of Town Meeting funding for phase 1 of the project has been approved! We will be issuing an RFP for this phase in hopes of having it completed in the spring.

The PD assisted the MBTA and FD this month at an Operation Crossing Blitz conducted at the Willow Road railroad crossing. The goal of the event was to provide motorists with educational materials relating to crossing safety.
