Re: November Monthly Report

During the month of November 2018 the Police Department logged 663 events. We assisted the Fire Department on 59 medicals and 11 fire alarms. Here are some of the highlights:

Radio Follow-up: Towers and poles have been installed at all three locations and equipment is being transferred. We are on track for an installation end date that has been moved to December and final testing completed by January.

The dispatch regionalization with Shirley was scheduled to be completed this month with the finalization of the migration of our mutual records keeping systems into one place. Unfortunately challenges with the move have occurred and the migration will now not be complete until January.

This month we began Communicator interviews to fill an open position. We hope to have a final candidate early next month.

November 2018 Monthly Report

The Department has joined a pilot program being run by the Middlesex Sheriff's Office entitled Data Driven Justice Partnership. There are three of these pilots being run across the nation with Middlesex county being the largest. The goal of the Partnership is to identify frequent users of the Criminal Justice and Mental Health systems that may use services in differing communities and so have fallen through the cracks. Once identified other options for assistance can be sought and offered thereby breaking the cycle of use.

Training classes that officers attended during March, either collectively or individually, were in the areas of:

CJIS/NCIC User Recertification Officer in Charge Defensive Tactics Dynamics of Domestic Violence School Safety Handling Mental Health Search Warrants Surviving the Unthinkable

In total the Department spent 160 hours in training for the month.
