Director's Report for February 2022

Current operations:

- As of March 4, 2022, the Library is following the Town of Ayer's mask mandate. Masks are recommended but not required for library visitors and staff.
- We continue to offer curbside pickup service via the Curbside Shed. The default pickup location for requested items is the Main Desk. Please call us to have your requested items placed in the shed.
- The Friends' Book Sale Room now officially renamed the Friends' Book Cellar on the Ground Floor is open.
- The Reading Room in the historic wing of the building remains closed to the public until we can repair the plaster ceiling that partially collapsed in May 2021.
- Some programs are now available in person (Story Time), virtual programming is still be offered.

February Updates

- <u>REDUCED HOURS</u> Effective February 1st: Due to a staffing shortage, the Library will close two hours earlier than usual on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings for the months of February and March. Our hours will be as follows:
 - Tuesday- Thursday 10 AM 6 PM, Friday 10 AM 5 PM, Saturday 10 AM 2 PM
- Website: Assabet Interactive has been added to the library's website. This allows patrons to book the Study Room and reserve Museum Passes from home. This has also given the library a more functional Events Calendar, allowing patrons to sign-up for programs through the calendar.

- <u>Summer Reading:</u> Planning for Summer Reading is underway. The Library will be hosting three programs, Adult, Teens, and Kids. The Library will be partnering with iRead for all promotional materials. This year's theme is *Off the Beaten Path*.

- Historic Reading Room Ceiling Repair: There has been no change in the tentative scheduling of the repair work. As of February 28th, the Town's Capital Planning Committee has approved the Library's request for \$48,500 to make the necessary repairs. These funds would be available following the Annual Town Meeting on April 25th, provided the voters approve the capital budget.
- The heat went out multiple times this month. Chuck Shultz helped to facilitate the repairs. One of the dampers to the outside malfunctioned and
