## Conservation Commission Monthly Report October 2022

The Commission continues its work enforcing the Wetlands Protection Act and local Bylaws and Regulation through site inspections on new and continuing projects. The Commission had two meetings in October, which the Commission discussed their Conservation Recommendation to the Planning Board for the Stratton Hill Subdivision and issued two Certificates of Compliance for the Willows Housing Development project.

The Commission at their October 13<sup>th</sup> meeting finalized their recommendation to the Planning Board for the Proposed Stratton Hill Subdivision. A few Commission members were present at the Planning Board's October 25<sup>th</sup> meeting to discuss the recommendation.

The Commission at their October 27<sup>th</sup> meeting issued two Certificates of Compliance for the Willows Development Project off of Willow Road.

The Conservation Agent continues to go out and inspect ongoing projects including weekly visits to Ayer Solar II and meet with residents to discuss concerns on their property. The Agent has also attended several field training sessions to further their knowledge and network with other Conservation Staff. The office is continuing the work on several administrative projects during the slowdown of applications including updating the template for special order of conditions and several possible policies and Regulation updates.
