AYER LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

December 2022

FACILITIES

- The elevator was inspected without issue December 2.
- Luke and Chuck met with Anne Savoie, Systems/Networking Manager for CW MARS on December 12 to discuss what is needed to route the Town's new VOIP phone system through the CW MARS lines.
- The primary HVAC repairs have been completed. All invoices are in and work has thus far exceeded the \$35,000 budget by\$891.75. That sum will come out of our regular services budget without issue. Unfortunately the heat in the staff lounge continues to malfunction. Chuck has been working on getting technicians to address what appears to be a software issue that has been causing the problem. At present we are working on resolving some IT issues that will allow them to do the repair remotely.
- Luke has been in touch with the Department of Public Works to understand Library snow removal procedures. They brought a bucket of ice melt for us to use on the sidewalks.

PERSONNEL

- Luke continues to explore staffing options and hopes to move forward with some personnel plans as the FY24 budget becomes clearer.
- Barbara attended an MLS training on burnout in the workplace.

OPERATIONS

- Luke held an all-staff meeting on December 2 to set some standards for communication and begin to outline a vision for the library. Because of illness, we had to cancel meetings planned for December 9 and 16. We are planning to schedule a follow-up meeting as soon as we have more information regarding the budget.
- Luke met with Barbara and Amy on December 7 to discuss staffing and programming.
- Luke, Barbara, and Amy met on December 15 to review procedures for responding to inclement weather.
- Luke, Amy, and Becca met on December 15 to discuss options for increasing programming and staff support for Youth Services. Raye has already been developing a D&D club that will launch January 25. After our discussion, Amy and Becca came up with a great new weekly Sensory Storytime concept that will launch January 27.
- We have had several people out sick for various reasons again this month, contributing to more coverage crunches. Staff have stepped up to fill in gaps however necessary. Their flexibility is much appreciated!
- As a thanks for everyone's hard work this year, with the Trustees' support, we closed the Library on December 23 and 30 to give folks some additional time to recuperate.
