# AYER LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

# **FACILITIES**

- On May 3 WM moved the dumpsters to a more sensible location.
- On May 5 all of the interior and exterior windows were cleaned.
- On May 15 we had the carpets and upholstered furniture cleaned.

# PERSONNEL & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- On May 8 and 9, staff attended the MLA Conference
  - Becca: "Attending the MLA conference was a wonderful experience to connect with fellow librarians and discuss a myriad of topics, from planning dynamic Dungeons and Dragons sessions to dealing with the rise of censorship, book banning, and conflict in library spaces across the country. It was wonderful to gain knowledge and insight on specific and niche topics of my job, like developing programming and curating collections for neurodiverse youth, as well as to learn about different areas of librarianship, such as library social work and legal librarianship. Attending the conference filled me with many new ideas and exciting opportunities to connect with other librarians and brainstorm about possibilities here in Ayer!"
  - Raye: "I was able to attend the annual MLA Conference on their Tuesday session, where I attended the keynote address given by Michael J. Bobbit. This

keynote address was particularly moving as Bobbit discussed his childhood and how his library served as a safe haven for him as he grew up. Bobbit discussed how libraries in the past have neglected the very communities that need them the most (low-income families, first-generation immigrants, people of color, people with disabilities, LGBTQ people, etc.) and how now more than ever it is our duty as librarians to create libraries where everyone can feel safe and welcomed. I also attended programs put on by other libraries/librarians in the Mass Library System, which included Who Let the Dogs Out? Using Therapy Dogs to Help Your Patrons De-Stress (Worcester Public Library and Tufts Paws for People); Library Programming for Neurodiverse Youth (Reading, Holbrook, Medford, and Lexington Libraries); and Trans Identities: Myths and Misinformation (Morrill Memorial Library). I really enjoyed getting to network with other librarians from libraries across Massachusetts, as well as getting to attend the panels which contained information that I feel would be immensely beneficial towards growing and evolving our library's programming and outreach. All the presenters were very professional, and I felt that I walked away with valuable knowledge and insights that I can use to better myself as a librarian to serve my community. I am so immensely thankful for the opportunity to attend this conference, and I hope to be able to attend it next year!"

- Luke: "It was a wonderful experience to return to MLA this year after several years not attending. It was important to reconnect with colleagues across the state who might not have known about my transition to Ayer. Several sessions Monday addressed different challenges that directors (especially new directors) face, and I learned a lot. Tuesday's keynote with Michael J. Bobbitt was a highlight and reminder of our core values. On Tuesday I was also able to meet in person with representatives from MLA and the MBLC who I have been corresponding with as I learn more about my new role. And I connected with some vendors to explore new products we might offer the library. Most of all, it was a wonderful opportunity to grow relationships with Becca and Raye—we all came away energized and eager to take Ayer to the next level. I am excited about offering this professional development opportunity to staff in the future."

  - On June 10, 2023 from 10-12pm we will be hosting a Pride Party in the Children's Room. There will be games, activities, and music.
  - On June 10, 2023 from 4-5pm Rowley Public Library has organized a virtual event for teens with New England Drag Queen Giganta Smalls and invited us and 27 other participating libraries (including Groton and Fitchburg) to participate. During this program, Giganta Smalls will present an inside view into the life of a drag queen, how she became interested in it, why she does it, and how it has helped her become more confident.
  - On Wednesday, June 21 we will be hosting a panel for community members, families, and trans/questioning individuals where a group of trans librarians from across New England will talk about their experiences with being transgender, as well as answer questions about trans terminology and etiquette. This program will serve as a safe space for individuals to engage in

respectful dialogue regarding the unique experience that gender identity is for all of us.
