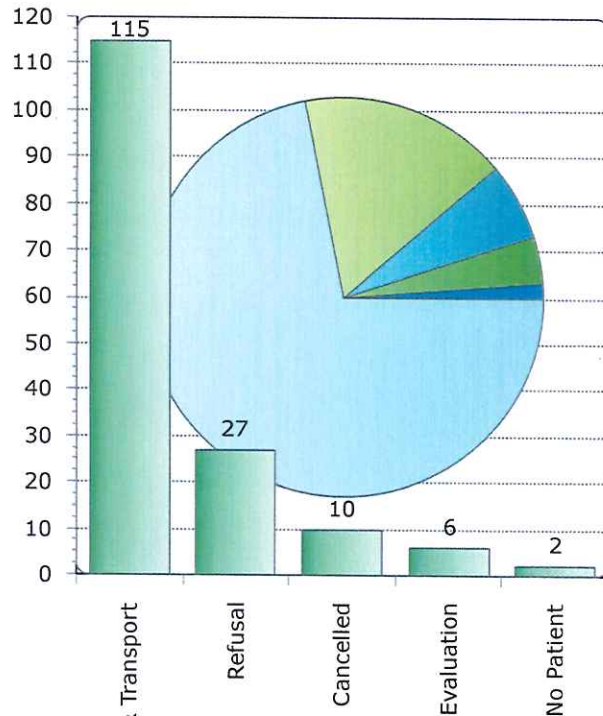

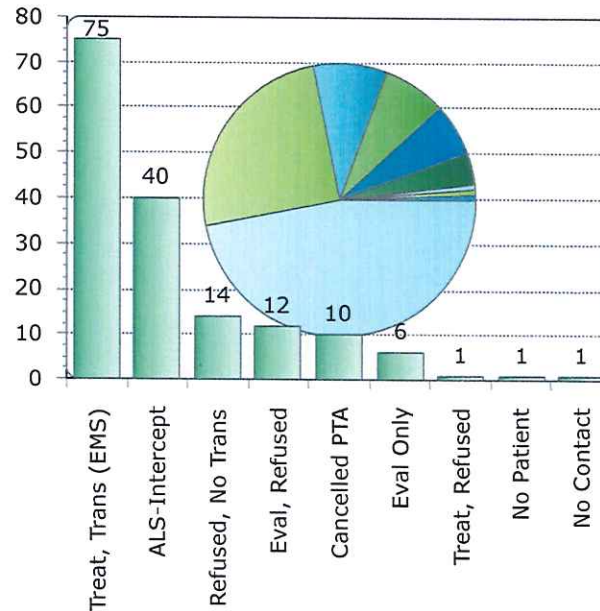
## Dashboard - Disposition Dashboard

Disposition Group



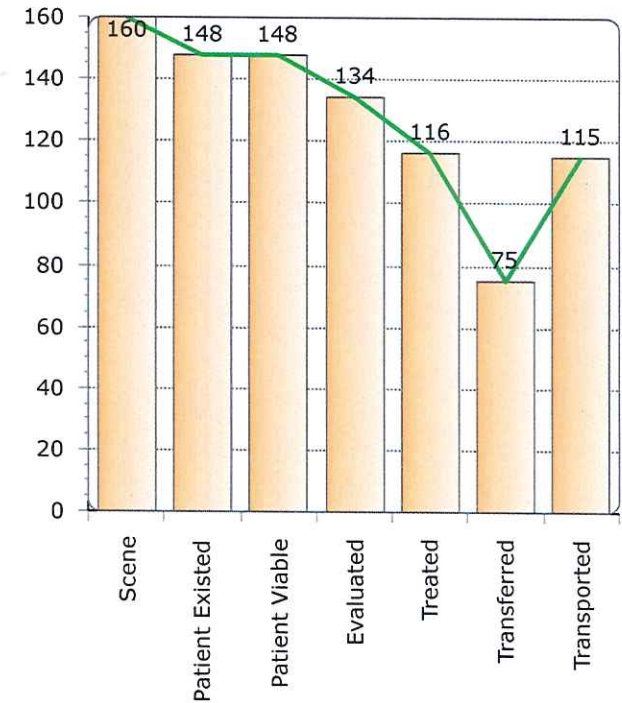

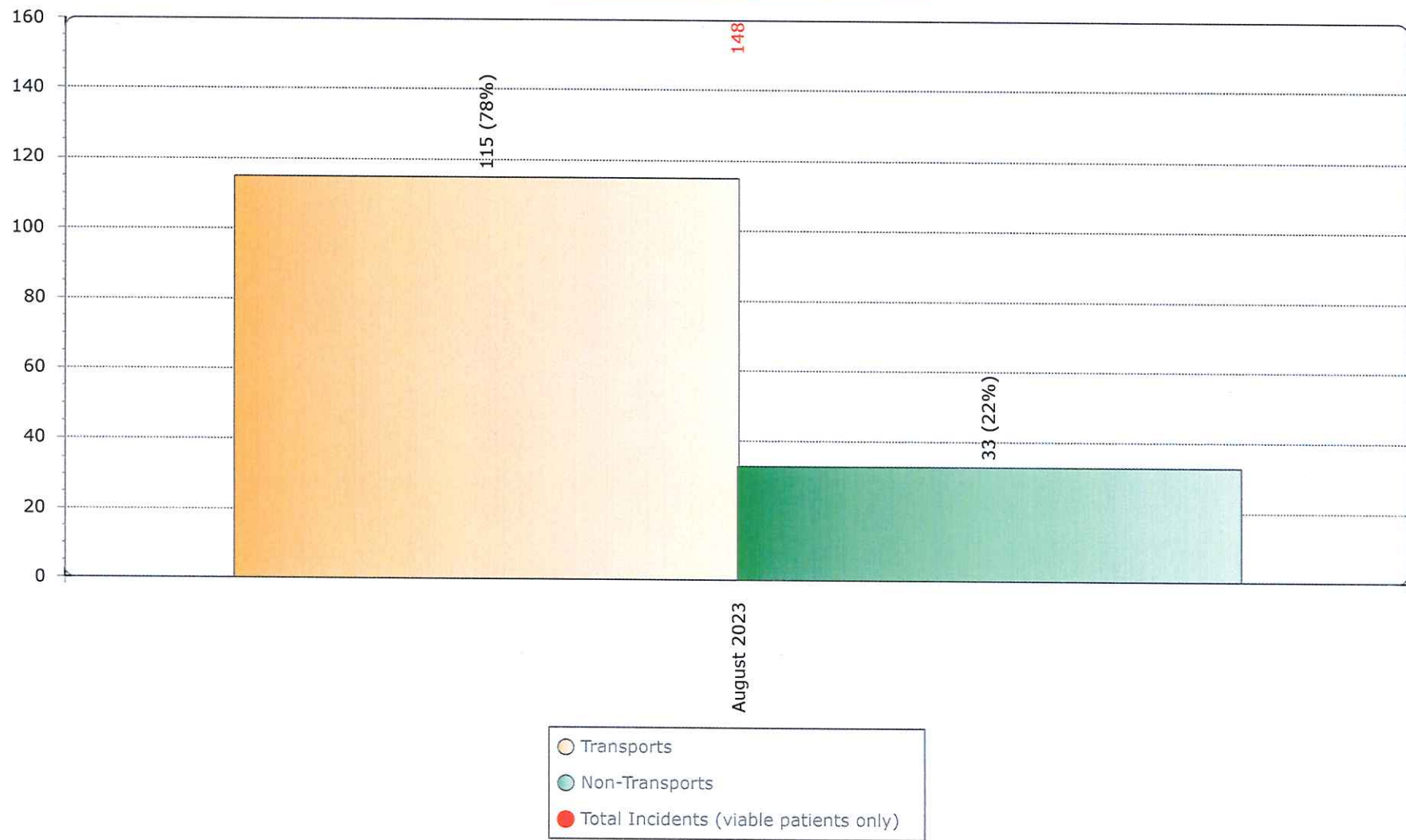
