AYER LIBRARY

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This October we see on display the breadth of programming we've built for our patrons through the creativity of our staff and our successful community partnerships. Story Ninja resumes after school, bringing us to three weekly storytimes—up from one last year. The Family Partnership returns with biweekly Music & Movement programs Tuesday mornings. Dungeons & Dragons offer one-off quests plus longer adventures for tweens and teens. Our monthly Pokemon Club is back in action. We celebrated National Hispanic Heritage Month with an all ages cooking class from Latino-owned Third Space Kitchen. We hosted another flu clinic and launched a new grief counseling group in partnership with Nashoba Associated Boards of Health. The Ayer Film Society continues its monthly screenings. Stitch Group is growing. And we added two new themed book groups for adults—Thriller Book Group and Historical Fiction Book Group—for a total of three. Meanwhile, highly anticipated repairs to the roof and HVAC system will conclude in early November. And while we've said farewell to one staff member, welcomed a former employee back temporarily, hired a new Clerk, and are actively working to fill our vacancies. Winter approaches, but we're keeping moving and staying warm!

FACILITIES

- We received good news that the boiler was available ahead of schedule and work would begin on 10/30. The Library will be without heat through the week. We will do our best to keep the building as comfortable as possible for staff and patrons.
- Roof repairs were completed, but did not entirely resolve the leak. Roofers will return to finish.
- I submitted our FY25 Capital Request on 10/23. We requested \$25,000 for sidewalk/exterior repairs.

ACTION PLAN

- **2.4.b.** In Progress. We have had to delay finalizing our work with staff SMART goals but will finalize conversations soon.
- 4.2.c. In Progress. Children's Librarian Becca Kranz visited an ASRHS study hall on 10/4 and the
 freshman humanities classes (all of the English and History classes) on 10/13 to help students fill
 out library card applications, discuss research resources available via the Library databases, share
 news about our additions to the Teen Room, and gather suggestions for Library offerings. 35 teens
 made new cards from these two visits! We have not had success with our Anime/Manga/Comics
 Club, however, and have canceled that to consider other opportunities.

OPERATIONS

- On 10/2 the patron computer system was upgraded to CloudNine. This cloud-based solution offers
 a variety of new features that will allow us additional flexibility for patrons seeking to reserve
 library equipment.
- On 10/6 I met with Maura Deedy from the MBLC to discuss details of our policy drafts.
- We have seen an increase in Teen Room use already since Becca's outreach and the installation of the TV, Playstation 5, and gaming PCs.
- In coordination with the Town's Halloween festivities, the Library welcomed trick-or-treaters on 10/28. Many families made the trek over the bridge for a visit.
- Our Baby Bags project is moving ahead after further coordination with the Town Clerk, the Friends, and the Town Social Worker. We hope to launch the initiative in January.
- We are still awaiting input from Town Counsel on the new Patron Conduct Policy, Reading Room Policy, and Safe Youth Policy drafts.

PERSONNEL & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Amy Leonard took the Library Juice Academy's Equity in Early Literacy course from 10/2-10/29 thanks to support from the Massachusetts Library System.
- On 10/4 Library Assistant Sue Hauk attended a training on running reports in Evergreen.
- On 10/17 Raye attended the New England Library Association conference.
- Caleb Brown resigned on 10/21. He will be very missed. We wish him the best!
- On 10/31 I attended a webinar about the NEH Preservation Assistance Grant. Based on what I learned, a more appropriate grant for our needs will be an MBLC grant opening in January that will offer financial support to conduct an assessment of our current archives.
- Isaiah Donovan was re-hired as a Library Substitute and will be filling in during November.
- We posted and interviewed for 2 part-time positions: Library Clerk and Office Assistant. Tirza Davis has been hired as our new Library Clerk. We did not identify an appropriate candidate for the Office Assistant.
