We are excited to announce two of the candidates for Police Officer have passed their comprehensive background investigations and have become "new hires".

The first new hire is Jacob Noll, who comes to us as a transfer from Shirley PD, where he has worked for a little over one year after graduating from the academy. He will be starting his 11 week field training in early December.

The second new hire is Jacquelyn Stiles, who is currently attending the Police Academy at Merrimack College. The police academy at Merrimack College is an innovative program that is combined with dual enrollment in the master's degree program. She is highly regarded by the academy staff, and we are excited to attend her graduation in April 2024.

We continue the comprehensive background investigations on one other candidate and are working on identifying one more exceptional Police Officer candidates. We will be moving expeditiously through the processes to get the new officers on the street as soon as possible.

In Dispatch personnel news, we are excited to welcome Per-Diem Dispatcher Kevin Lewis to the Ayer PD / ASRECC. Kevin will receive the same initial training mandated by the MA State 911 Department as a full time dispatcher would, and then he will be assigned to an in-house training program with an experienced dispatcher.

On November 2nd, along with the Fire Department and the Department of Public Works, had the kickoff meeting to begin planning the Ayer Independence Day 2024 with the citizen group spearheading the event. A two-day event is being planned for June 22 and June 23. November also saw other event planning sessions for the AFD Thanksgiving 5K, the Holiday Tree Lighting, Santa Parade.

In November Sgt. MacDonald and his team of elves began the 23rd Annual Ayer PD Holiday Toy Drive. Beginning around Thanksgiving, the Ayer PD, Town Hall and Library started collecting new unwrapped gifts to be distributed directly back to the Ayer Community to children in need.

Members of the Ayer PD participated in "No Shave November", where they are allowed to forgo the shaving requirements for a \$100 donation to MGH / Home Base – Veteran and Family Care. The Department and its supporters raised approximately \$1,300! We extend our support to Veteran programs into the next nonth with "Double Down December", where officers can continue their "no-shave" by making a \$100 donation to Clear Path New England on Devens.
